Management and Operational Activities:

- **Management and Operation Updates and Items / Requests and Recommendations for Future Consideration:**

- For the month of February 2025 Blue Line read, handled, reviewed, and/or responded to 251 emails to the GM email account and 118 emails to the Customer Service email account.
- GM and Southern Botanical had a field meeting with their crews. Landscape Development Services has refused to meet with us regarding meter separation, citing they were too busy.
- Radar signs and trailer delivery is now expected in May 2025.

- **Mustang Water Reports, Appeals, UTRWD Updates or Concerns:**

- Blue Line handled multiple extension requests, disconnects, Adjustments, and refunds with Mustang SUD again this month.
- UTRWD remains in Stage 1 Drought Restriction. Mustang SUD and The Districts are also in Stage 1.

- **Trash Collection Service Updates/Issues:**

- For the month of February the GM's office received fewer complaints regarding trash and recycling. There were a few instances of missed bins or trash, recycling and bulk being left down, but in most instances the items were recovered by Waste Connections the following day. Operations appear to be going smoother at this time.

Maintenance Issues/Updates/Concerns :

1. GM continues looking into complaints of Little Elm ISD buses loading and unloading on South Paloma Creek at Lake Grove and causing excessive traffic delays and frustrating motorists. GM has presented a possible solution to GoldStar Transportation and is awaiting a response.
2. Blue Line received a call from LEFD requesting assistance in clearing and cleaning the roads and sidewalks after a structure fire in the 2000 block of Lake Vista. Blue Line contractors completed the cleaning immediately after the crime scene was released.

C. District 11 A:

Maintenance Issues/Updates/Concerns :

1. A check from GEICO was received regarding their insured driver running into a District tree. Southern Botanical has been given authorization to replace the damaged tree in the median on South Paloma Creek near Rosson.
2. Blue Line responded to an emergency call of a tree down in the roadway after a storm. Blue Line requested LEFD assistance and they responded quickly to move the tree from the roadway while the Blue Line Team mobilized. Blue Line cut up the felled tree and disposed of it.

D. District 11 B:

Maintenance Issues/Updates/Concerns :

1. ABHR is attempting to find resolution with the developer and the Town of Little Elm regarding the damages and lack of irrigation systems in the southernmost three medians on PC Blvd. An estimate (23566) was received in the amount of \$33,899.40 to install needed irrigation infrastructure (requires boring under the road).
2. 2200 block of Scott Creek: Continued oil leak issues with a resident's car. Car is now parking on the opposite side of the street and creating more oil stains. ABHR to escalate.
3. Blue Line continues to communicate with and receive updates from Mustang SUD regarding valve risers that are trip hazards within the district.

4. Collum Trees has completed removal of the dead and felled trees along and in the greenbelt and creek channel between Abby Creek and Eppright Dr. Their six man crew worked for six days to remove the trees.
5. Blue Line mobilized a five man trash and debris collection team to remove trash and debris from along the channel. The crews also worked on breaching new beaver dams which continue to pop-up. Wildlife X Team has snares in place and Blue Line continues to monitor.

Engineering Related Matters for Consideration and/or Approval:

Updates:

1. GM and engineer will start inspections for the annual street maintenance project. This year, the plan is to combine all 5 districts into one project to save on mobilization fees and possibly obtain volumetric discounts on concrete and sealant.
2. Engineer is finalizing the scope of services for the remaining grading work along the creek channel between Abby Creek and Eppright Dr. Once completed, bids will be sought and this will complete the final phase of the project.
3. Vlex Construction is making good progress on the Ordonez project despite the sub freezing temperatures and rainfall. The first section or half of the roadway is expected to be poured the week of March 10th. The Engineer, Project Manager and GM have coordinated schedules to ensure daily site visits for documentation purposes and to ensure compliance with best practices and adherence to contract specifications. Aggregate Soil Test and Proctor Test Report are being received in a timely manner from GeoTex and are reviewed and filed accordingly.

Pay application(s) will not be submitted until the entire road has been poured.



4. GM and Engineer responded to reports of drainage issues on Angus Drive. Loutfall areas need to be graded so the area will drain properly. Trash collection and silt fence removal is also needed in this area.

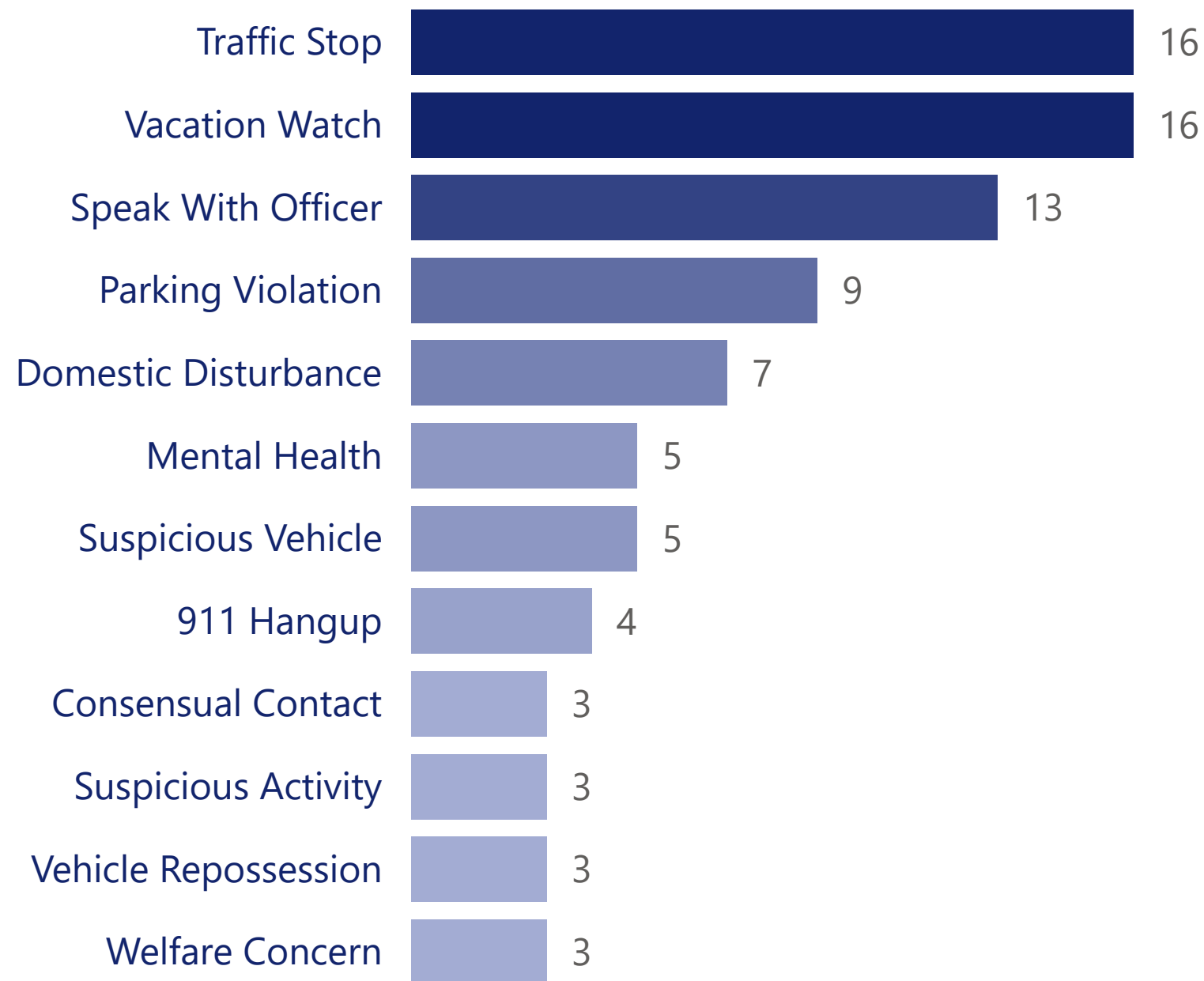

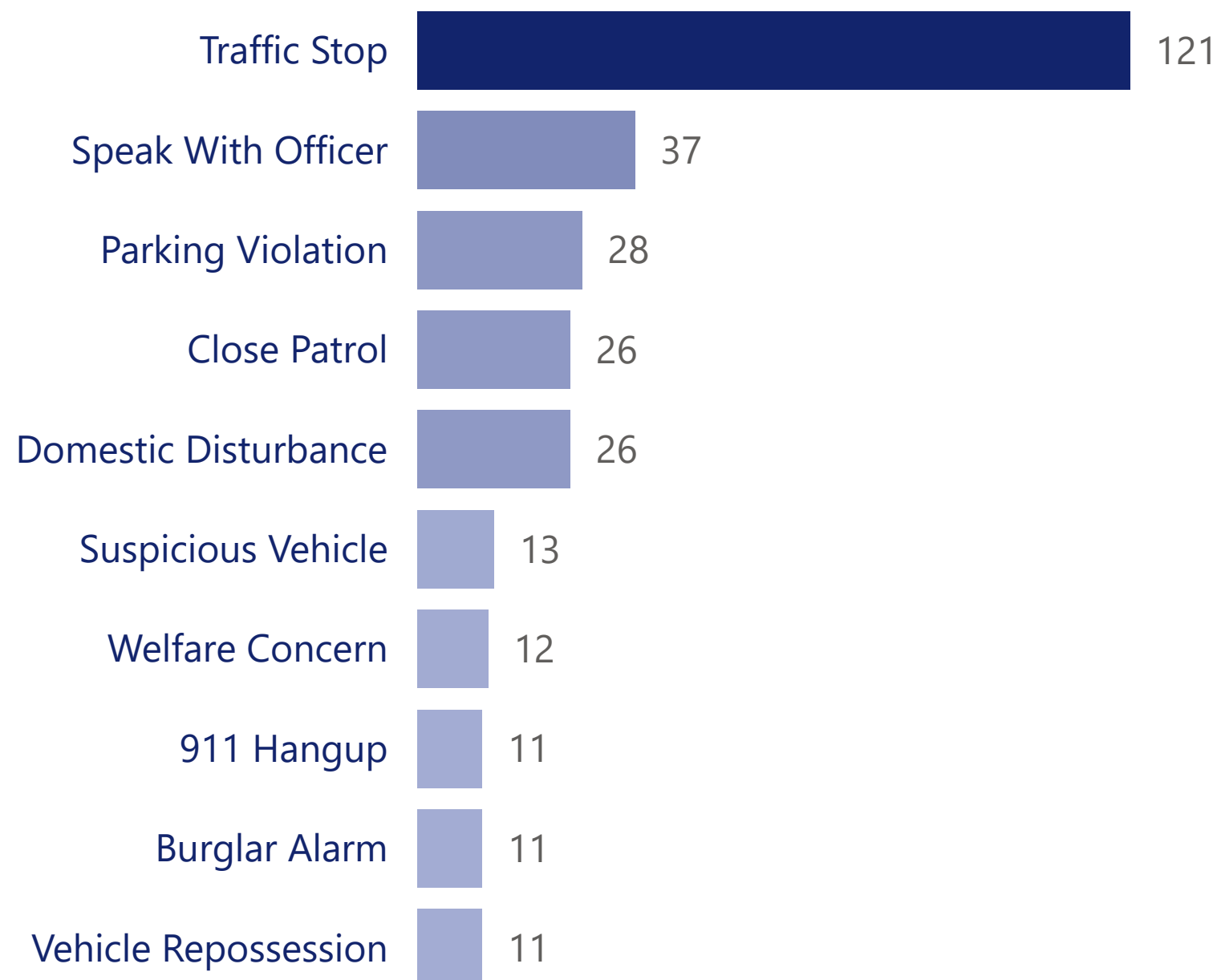

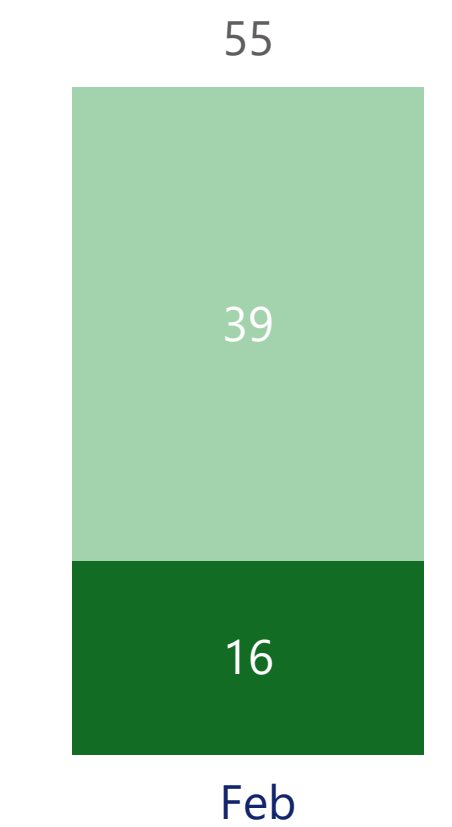

Paloma Creek & Northlake Estates Briefs- February

Lieutenant. A. McKinney

Warrant Service / Saltbranch Rd/Meandering Trl- Officer was patrolling the area for burglary activity and observed a subject walking with all black on during the early morning hours. Officer made contact with the subject, who voluntarily identified himself. The subject showed to have a TCIC/NCIC warrant for Evading Arrest Detention out of Collin CO. A search of the subject revealed a black ski mask. Subject denied being involved in burglary activity. The subject was transported to Denton County Jail without incident. **Arrest Made.**

LEPD Warrants/Other Agency Warrants /Toucan Drive/Snowbird Drive - Traffic stop for Display Expired Registration. PC search conducted yielding drug paraphernalia. Driver arrested on outstanding warrants from LEPD, Mesquite, Arlington and Frisco PD. **Multiple traffic citations issued, arrest made.**

Unl. Installation of Tracking Device /Scott Creek: Officer was dispatched to a residence in Oak Point in reference to an AOA. While on scene, it was found that the victim had an Airtag taped to their vehicle and the tag was on their vehicle since it left her residence in Little Elm. **Report completed.**

Runaway/Albatross: Officers were dispatched to the listed residence in reference to a runaway. Officers were advised that a juvenile female ran away after she was supposed to turn herself in for violating her probation. **Report completed.**

Officers conducted concentrated traffic stops in the area of Paloma Creek due to reports of increased criminal activity. Multiple close patrols of the Ryan Spiritas subdivision were also made.

Assault by Contact FV /Creekside Dr. - Rp called and stated she slapped BF to defend herself. Officers arrived and determined he BF did not assault RP. RP was determined to be the aggressor. RP taken into custody and transported to LEDP jail facility. **Arrest made.**

Warrant Arrest, other agency /Paloma Creek/University- Officers conducted a traffic stop for a traffic violation. Driver's information was ran and was found to have a warrant out of Collin Count. **Warrant was confirmed and arrest made.**

Additional patrols in the area of Paloma creek and Spiritas Ranch.

Sexual Assault / Lake Hollow Dr- Officer was dispatched to speak with officer cfs, where victim reported that her husband of eight years had allegedly sexually assaulted her after drugging her with an unknown melatonin gummy. Information was gathered and report was generated and completed. **Report Completed.**

Theft of Driver's License / Oriel Drive- Pedestrian stop for walking in roadway where sidewalk provided. Pedestrian was identified and found to have 3 active LEPD warrants. Consent search conducted yielding Florida DL belonging to another person. The owner of the DL was contacted and advised that their wallet was stolen out of their vehicle several days ago in Paloma Creek and they wished to pursue charges. As Officer was conducting this investigation, the below CFS came out in the area and the Officer seized the DL and broke contact with the male to respond. Report completed; charge filed at large. **Report completed.**

Agg Assault with Deadly Weapon SBI / Kittyhawk Drive- Officers were dispatched to 1601 Kittyhawk Drive in reference to a 911 hang-up. Upon arrival, Officers located a male inside the residence who was in and out of consciousness with a significant laceration to his forehead, and a female who admitted that she struck the male with a beer bottle after he attacked her with his fists and a chair. A witness on scene observed female strike male with a beer bottle as he was attempting to leave. Officers observed no visible injuries on the female suspect and her story changed several times. CID was notified and went to the hospital to meet with the male. Command staff was notified. Female was placed under arrest and transported to DCSO Jail. Male suffered concussing and needed 8 staples. **Arrest made.**

DWI/Navo Rd. and Union Pl- Officer stopped a vehicle where driver displayed signs of intoxication. Driver was only willing to perform the HGN. Driver was placed into custody, where he refused to provide blood, a search warrant was applied for and subsequently granted. Driver was transported to BSW, and later to Denton County Jail without incident. **Arrest Made.**

Robbery /E. University Dr. and Paloma Creek Dr. - Officers responded to a robbery at Pizza Hut, where a male had taken the victim's cell phone by force. The male was later located and identified as an active KTK gang member, the male admitted to taking the phone, where he was arrested and transported to Denton County Jail without incident. **Arrest Made.**

MHMR Complaint /Adrian Creek Dr.- Officers were dispatched to a mental health call regarding a female juvenile who was experiencing a mental health episode. Officers arrived on-scene and determined that the female was an immediate danger to herself or others, and was placed in emergency detention for her safety. The female was transported by LEFD to Cooks Hospital in Prosper for further evaluation, where officers provided an EDO to hospital staff. Detention Made. **Report Completed**

Warrant Arrest / Fail to ID Fugitive / Rivers Creek - Officer initiated a traffic stop for a moving violation. The officer had PC to search the vehicle and while doing so, located an ID. The driver admitted to giving a false name. The driver had a warrant out of Harris County for Terroristic Threat Family Member, which was confirmed on. The driver was also charged with Fail to ID Fugitive. The driver was taken to the Denton County Jail. **Arrest made.**

Morning Dove /Agg Sexual Assault - Reporting party arrived at the PD to report a potential sexual assault that had previously occurred involving her son. RP stated her 12 YO female step-daughter reported a 20 YO male had previously touched her under and over her clothing multiple times over the past years. The 20 YO has been diagnosed with multiple disabilities and no longer lives in the same household. **Report completed.**

Criminal Mischief / Bird Cherry Ln - Officers dispatch to a vehicle that was "egged" overnight. No suspect information/ **Report completed.**

Information Call/Starling Lane- Counselor reported that her 16-year-old client, living at this residence, outcried to being sexually assaulted by a peer on multiple occasions while living in Pasadena, CA when she was 12 and 14 years of age. Counselor stated that she contacted Pasadena PD but they advised her that they would not take a report over the phone for this offense, despite her being an outcry witness and not a victim. To avoid unnecessary delay to the victim, a report was generated. **Report completed.**

Warrant Arrest /Cedarbird Dr.- Officers were dispatched to a domestic disturbance at this residence. Upon arrival, no offense had been committed, however, an involved individual possessed an active NCIC/TCIC warrant for FTA- Assault CBI FV out of DCSO. The warrant was confirmed on and this person was arrested. **Arrest Made.**

Warrant Service / S. Paloma Creek/Rosson- Officers conducted a traffic at the listed location and the driver was found to have a warrant for Unlawful Carry of a Weapon and DWI out of Denton County. Warrant was confirmed and subject was transported to Denton County Jail for bookng. **Arrest made.**

Driving While Intoxicated 2nd /Highway 380 & Navo Rd.- Officer made a traffic stop for an infraction and upon contact, smelled an odor of alcoholic beverages emitting from the driver's breath. The driver also displayed several other indications of intoxication. Driver performed SFSTs and the decision point was observed. Driver placed under arrest due to the totality of the circumstances. During CCH review, it was observed the driver had already been convicted of DWI once before, therefore, the offense was enhanced. **Arrest Made.**

Assault Family Member/Impeding Breath /Kittyhawk Dr.- Officers were dispatched to the residence in reference to a physical domestic disturbance. It was reported that the actor fled on foot prior to officers' arrival, however, officers were able to apprehend him in the area. Upon arrival, the victim reported that after an argument with her boyfriend, he strangled her which caused her breath to be impeded. Bodily injury observed consistent with the victim's report of what occurred; therefore, the suspect was arrested. **Arrest Made.**

Fail to Identify False/Fictitious Info (Fugitive from Justice) /Partridge Drive- Traffic stop for Fail to Stop at Designated Place. Passenger provided a name that did not return. Using records, Officer located names from a previous stop on the vehicle and found that the male ran in the prior stop had felony non-extraditable warrants out of Arkansas and an LEPD warrant for DWLI. Driver License photo confirmed true identify of passenger as the wanted subject. Passenger accused Driver of telling him to lie about his name, so he provided his brother's information. Passenger placed under arrest for offense and transported to DCSO Jail. **Arrest made.**

Driving While Intoxicated/Crash /East University Drive/Navo Road- Crash just before shift change. Driver of one vehicle suspected of DWI. SFST conducted and suspicion confirmed. Driver placed under arrest and transported to BSW for clearance and blood draw. Driver transferred to DCSO and booked in without incident. **Report completed.**

Runaway / E University Dr. & Paloma Creek: Officers responded to a runaway juvenile (12YOA) who was in a verbal dispute with their mother and ran across U.S. 380. Officers searched the area and subsequently located the juvenile at a family member's home; due to harsh weather conditions and the child's age, CID and Admin were notified. **Report completed.**

CPS Referral / Horizon Ridge Cir – CPS Referral alleging punching and striking with objects between mother and four children. **Report completed.**

Assault CBI Family Member/ Cedarbird Drive- Officers responded earlier in the shift for couple having verbal argument. Officers separated parties and left scene. Officers responded again after male half reported female walked past him and punched him in the back of the head before leaving the residence. While Officers were on scene with male, the female returned and was taken into custody and transported to DCSO Jail. **Arrest made.**

Driving While Intoxicated 2nd /Navo Rd. / Union Pl.- Officer stopped a vehicle for an infraction. Upon contact, officer observed indications that the driver was possibly intoxicated. Driver performed SFSTs and due to the results and previous observations, was placed under arrest. The charge was enhanced after a review of the driver's CCH, which revealed a previous conviction for DWI. **Arrest Made.**

POSS CS PG 2 < 1G/UCW / Villa Paloma Blvd & Eppright Dr.- Officer made a traffic stop for an infraction. Upon contact, obtained PC to search the vehicle. The search yielded MDMA, approx. 2 oz of Marijuana, small amount of mushrooms, and an AR pistol. The driver was placed under arrest for the above offenses. **Arrest Made.**

Theft of Firearm/ Oriole Dr – A caller reported that around 1246 this morning, someone rummaged through his vehicle and stole a firearm. There is surveillance footage that was uploaded to Axon. The firearm was entered into NCIC/TCIC. **Report completed.**
